All rescue pets will examined by a vet, provided any required medical care, spayed/ neutered, microchipped and vaccinated prior to adoption. In addition, puppies will be dewormed, given the appropriate vaccinations due for their age, and administered a round of Revolution.

There is an adoption fee for all our animals - often we have spent exceedingly more on vetting our rescues (see our Adoption Fees addendum for fee amounts and an explanation of where the fees go). We are a Not-for-profit Registered Canadian Charity - all our members are unpaid volunteers.
